Current motorcycle riders from Rudgeley and both Dingles have to walk from their blocks all the way to the Main Car Park in their protective clothing to collect their bikes. **This can be an unpleasant experience, and I aim to remove it by adding in an exclusive motorcycle parking zone in Residential Parking by the left of Smoker's Bench.** This location is ideal as it is too small for cars to park there, but big enough to hold multiple motorcycles.

Review: Food Quality

Food is the centre of Hartpury. It gives our students the required caloric and nutritional intake to study here. To those who eat at Graze, if that is an athlete, or an A Levels student, neither would be able to perform optimally without correct food intake, and quality. It concerns me greatly that personally, alongside my classmates, I have seen poor food quality; in particular: not fully cooked chicken. If one of our top athletes got food poisoning, that could have an extremely bad ricochet effect, preventing them from participating, damaging Hartpury. This is the same for all students who eat at Graze.

Therefore, I will consult the correct faculty and raise our concerns. I will listen carefully and make sure they understand the importance of this issue. I will oversee any potential policy changes, and actively monitor the quality, through personal scrutiny, and feedback from other students, to make sure the food at Hartpury is at a good standard.
